

## Joint Visit to Rundu State Hospital by Ambassador Nishimaki, UN Resident Coordinator Ms. Phororo, and UNICEF Representative Mr. Ocran (March 22, 2024)

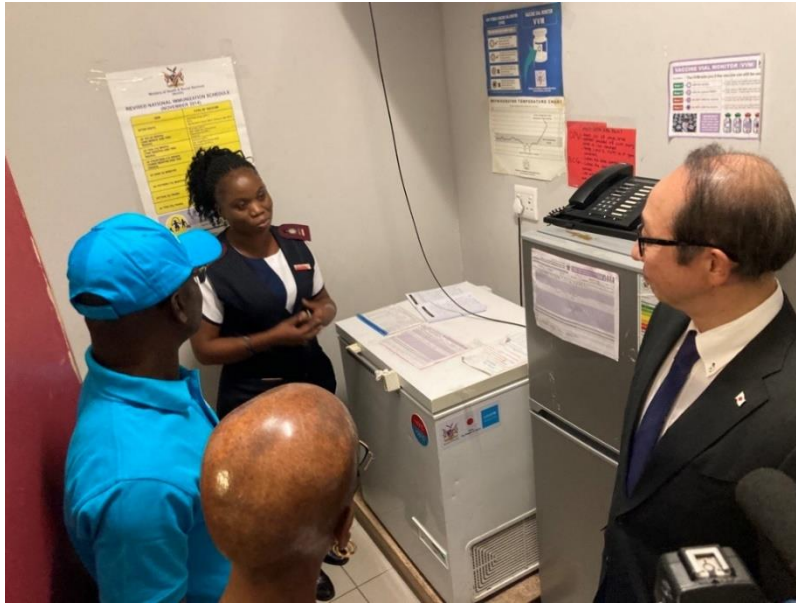
On 22 March 2024, Ambassador Nishimaki travelled to north-east Namibia and visited the Rundu State Hospital together with UN Resident Coordinator Ms. Phororo and UNICEF Representative Mr. Ocran. The hospital is equipped with cold chain equipment that was donated by the Japanese government under the "Support for Cold Chain Strengthening in response to COVID-19 pandemic in Namibia" (grant amount: US\$1,600,000) in FY2022/2023. Ambassador Nishimaki together with Ms. Phororo, UN Resident Coordinator, and Mr. Ocran, UNICEF Representative, confirmed the efficient and effective utilization of the equipment. During the visit, Ambassador Nishimaki spoke with nurses who were trained by the Japanese assistance and a mother whose child's life was saved by these highly trained nurses and donated equipment' s.
