Ambassador Nishimaki's site visit to Hyphen's Green Hydrogen project (July 23, 2024)

On July 23 2024, Ambassador Nishimaki visited Hyphen's Green Hydrogen project site near the harbour town of Lüderitz in southern Namibia. Ambassador familiarized himself with the Green Hydrogen project through a presentation by Hyphen.

The project is being developed as the first step in the implementation of the Namibian Government's strategy for the development of a large-scale Green Hydrogen industry. Hyphen Energy indicated that the US\$10 billion project is planned to be developed in phases, at full development targeting 350,000 metric tons of Green Hydrogen production a year from 7GW of renewable generation capacity and 3GW electrolyser. The project, once fully developed will employ an estimate of 3,000 people, with 15,000 construction jobs supported over the four-year construction period. Over 90% of these jobs are expected to be filled by local Namibians.
