

UNFPA – Ambassador Nishimaki Officiates at Handover of Medical Equipment, Mobile Clinic and Sanitary Pads (July 29th, 2024)

On July 29, 2024, Ambassador Nishimaki officiated at the Handover of Medical Equipment, a Mobile Clinic and Sanitary pads under the Japan Supplementary Budget Project Leaving No One Behind being implemented by UNFPA Namibia titled “Leaving No One Behind (LNOB) – Building back better from COVID-19: Restoring dignity and reshaping the future for women, girls, men and boys while mitigating Gender Based Violence (GBV) and negative Sexual and Reproductive Health (SRH) outcomes” .

The Namibian recipients of the generous donations from the Government of Japan where the Ministry of Health and Social Services (MoHSS), the Ministry of Education Arts and Culture and Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) represented by One Economy Foundation. The total value of the donated Medical Equipment, Mobile Clinic and Sanitary pads amounted to U\$211, 634 (N\$3, 809, 425)

The range of donated medical equipment includes bed screens on castors(67) cardiotocography (CTG) machines(15), ward screening gynaecological couch(8), doppler foetal heart rate detector monitors with accessories(6), adult physician scale on beam balances(6), ultrasound scanners mobile with printer and accessories(3).
