Book Donation Ceremony to the University of Namibia (20 May 2025)

On May 20, 2025, Ambassador Asama handed over 131 books donated to the University of Namibia (UNAM) through the Japan Foundation's "READ JAPAN PROJECT" to promote understanding of Japan at the UNAM Main Campus Library.
