

Courtesy Visit by Participants of the Teacher Overseas Training Program from JICA Tohoku and Nihonmatsu (31 July 2026)

On 31 July 2026, Mr. Sadamoto, Chargé d'Affaires of the Embassy of Japan received a courtesy visit from participants of the Teacher Overseas Training Program from JICA Tohoku and Nihonmatsu.

This training program aims to provide participants with opportunities to deepen their understanding of educational environments and social conditions overseas through firsthand experience, while also encouraging them to reflect on education and the circumstances surrounding children in Japan. The knowledge and insights gained through the program are intended to be applied to educational activities in Japan. During their one week stay in Namibia, the participants visited educational institutions in the country and engaged with local stakeholders, gaining a deeper understanding of Namibia's educational environment and social challenges.

During the courtesy call, the participants reported on the activities they conducted and the lessons they learned throughout the program. They also exchanged views on the characteristics and challenges of Namibian schools, as well as the challenges and initiatives currently facing educational institutions in Japan.

Mr. Sadamoto expressed his hope that the participants would apply the knowledge and experiences gained in Namibia to their future educational practices and further promote mutual understanding between Japan and Namibia.
